Bob graduated from Pennsylvania State University (2002) after earning his Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering. His professional experience with PBS & J includes Master Planning, Conceptual Design, and Program Integration Services for BRAC05, Fort Belvoir, VA – Client: U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE). Bob served as a project engineer and task leader for various transportation projects associated with the relocation of 23,000 Department of Defense employees to Fort Belvoir.

Another project of note was the Area Development Guide and Plan, Wiesbaden Army Airfield (WAAF), Wiesbaden, Germany – Client: US Army Corps of Engineers, Europe District (USAREUR). Bob served as a lead transportation engineer for the development guide and development plan for the relocation of the 7th Army Command and Control Facility, Consolidated Intelligence Center, and the Network Warfare Center to Wiesbaden Army Airfield.

Bob also served as a project engineer for developing a parking study and transportation management plan for the Tobyhanna Army Depot, PA – Client: U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE).

Bob was involved in the final design of SR 0043 and SR 0576-Mon-Fayette Expressway Uniontown to Brownsville, Section 51A-2 and 51A-3-PennDOT District 12-0. Specifically, he was the Engineer responsible for the design of the drainage collection system for the mainline.

In addition to his career as a professional engineer Bob served in the US Air Force as a jet engine inspector and mechanic overhauling C-5 General Electric TF-39 turbofan engines and C-130 Allison T56 turboprop engines with the US Air Force for 10 years.

Bob is a member of the Heritage Region Jeep Alliance (Zelienople, PA) a non-profit Jeep based organization with 250 members that promotes safe and responsible land use. The club holds an annual Toys for Tots drive, litter clean up on Interstate 79, and Jeepfest Event at Pearson Park in New Castle for the public.
